Before 6 Months

If your baby has a hearing loss:

- Enroll them in an early intervention program that has experience serving children with a hearing loss; and
- Regularly visit with your child's audiologist.

Be sure your baby's doctor/medical home sees all hearing screening results.

If your baby does not pass or misses the first hearing screening in one or both ears, schedule a hearing (re)screen at your local hospital.

If your baby does not pass the rescreening in one or both ears, schedule an appointment with a pediatric audiologist right away!

Contact the Wyoming EHDI Program with any questions or to get help.

Be sure your pediatric audiologist has experience testing children under six months of age!

If your baby has a hearing loss, the next steps are:

- Contact the Wyoming EHDI Program;
- Tell your baby's doctor; and
- Contact your local child development center.

Evaluations to discuss with your baby's doctor/medical home:

- Ophthalmologist (eye specialist);
- Genetic specialist; and
- Other medical specialists.
